

 Joseph Greasy as commissioners to lay off and apportion to Elizabeth Norris
 widow and child of Gabriel Norris dec'd her dower in the lands of the s^d
 Gabriel Norris dec'd consisting of 234 acres lying and being in the said
 County on the banks of the Narrows Creek -

That the above named Commissioners have
 this 25th day of November 1823 met, and
