Thirdly I give and bequeath all my property of
 every description to my beloved wife Lucy W. Walden
 during her natural life or so long as she shall
 remain a widow should my wife marry or die before
 my youngest child shall become of age I wish my
 Executors to keep the property together for the benefit
 of my children and when the youngest shall have
 attained the age of twenty one I wish it to be
 equally divided between them (Fourthly) I do by
 this will appoint my friend John W. Priest
 Executor to this my last will and testament In
 testimony whereof I do hereunto set my hand and
 seal this twenty eighth day of February Eighteen
 hundred and forty six
