

desire that my negro woman Lydia be set up and sold to the highest bidder if she will bring any thing and if she will not then set her up for the lowest bidder and her expenses be paid out of my estate

Tenthly It is further my will and desire that the balance of my negroes viz John Thomas Leachariah and Larkin be kept on the place to keep to support the family unless it should be thought advisable to hire John or Thomas or both of them out which either one or both must be hired if they do not behave will stay at home and attend to business well as long as the Executor may think it to the interest of a majority of the heirs and when the hire amounts to four hundred dollars over and above what is necessary for the support of the family I wish it equally divided amongst all my heirs

Eleventhly It is my will and desire that my land subject to the use of my heirs except the six acres which I have left to my wife until her death and then to be equally divided among my heirs

Twelfthly It is my will and desire that my grand daughter Helen K Newton & shall be sent to school and given a good common english education and the expense be paid out of my estate

Thirteenthly it is my will and desire that all of my estate both real and personal & ~~will~~ shall be equally divided amongst all my children & grand daughter Helen K Newton and viz Dianna Graves Priscilla McCormick Elizabeth Kelly Mary Newton & Jeremiah McCormick after deducting three hundred dollars from the part of Dianna Graves

Fourteenthly it is further my will and desire that the part left hereafter may come to my daughter Elizabeth shall be subject to the control of my executor in the same manner that is expressed in the deed of gift for Isaac and as Isaac is worth six hundred dollars the other are all to have fifty dollars more than the Elizabeth is at the next division

Fifteenthly, It is my will and desire that Sally Newton the widow of Charles K Newton should be supported as she has been since she has been in my family

Lastly I support my brother Williams and James Newton my Executors of this my last will and testament to which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty six
