I desire all my children to have an equal part of my estate my son William Lashbrook has received four hundred and eighty dollars my son J Morris Lashbrook has received four hundred and ninety dollars my daughter Parcus Gordin has received three hundred and fifty dollars my daughter Nancy Stewart has received three hundred and thirty seven dollars my daughter Elizabeth Mark has received three hundred and fourteen dollars these my children above named are to account for what they have received to the other heirs as a final division and settlement of the estate I desire my beloved wife to keep all the property now in her possession as long as she remains single for the purpose of raising and educating the children with this understanding that she is to give them my children yet single with her as much property as the other heirs has received when they become grown and wish to leave their mother it is further my wish and will that my sons James Wesley & Marcus Linsey Lashbrook is to have the tract of land on which I now live at the death my wife it is my wish that those my two youngest sons are to have an equal part of the estate beside the land above named in testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of August 1833

62 In the name of God Amen, I Franky M Farland of Davies County in the state of Kentucky being of sound mind but in a low state of health do make and ordain this my last will and testament, in manner following to wit first I recommend my soul to almighty God who gave it and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner and as for my entirely estate I leave as follows.
Item I give to my son Abner Lee my negro man Johnson to him for his life time after which to go to his son Hugh Lee, and in case of his death to Margaret
Item I give to my grand daughter Margaret Ann Lee my negro woman Matilda & her son John to be left in the possession of Abner Lee until said Margaret Anne comes of age or marries, to the said Margaret Anne and her heirs forever the said Lee to pay no hire for the sd negroes while in his possession
Item My desire is that all the increase of the said Matilda while in the possession of Abner Lee, shall be divided among his children, first to Elizabeth Lee and then to the other of the children to wit Madison Lee Hugh Lee and after that should they have more after them three all to go to Margaret Ann Lee to them and their heirs forever
Item I give to my two grand daughters Margaret Ann Lee & Elizabeth Lee my two beds & furniture to be equally divided between them
Item I give to my grand daughter Franky Lashbrook one feather bed now in her possession to her & her heirs forever together with all notes and accounts that I have against William Lashbrook the husband of Franky Lashbrook also my corn shup & Harynes that I have also my square table
Item I give to my two grand daughters Margaret A Lee and Elizabeth Lee my Bureau as to the balance of my house hold furniture, I give to Abner Lee together with my stock of cattle & Hogs to him and his heirs forever
Item I hold at this time some accounts against several persons which debts I give to Abner Lee and also all the money that I may have at my decease after paying all my just debts and funeral expenses likewise my saddle I give to Margaret Lee the wife of Abner Lee And Lastly
my desire is that my son Abner Lee act as Executor to this my last will & testament In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 3rd day of July 1833.

My will and desire is that the property left to Margerita Ann Lee be to her bodily heirs and that if she should die without issue that the property be equally divided between her brothers & sisters I will to Mary Elizabeth Lee one negro boy by the name of Lewis to her bodily heirs forever and if she should die without issue to be equally divided between her brothers & sisters the boy named is one of Matilda's children & being her part of the first increase as before named of Matilda's

further I Lastly the balance of Matilda's children of any I wish to be equally divided between the children of Abner Lee In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 4th day of Aug. 1835

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In the name of God Amen, The twenty 2nd of January one thousand eight hundred & thirty six

I Benjamin Newton of the County of Davies and state of Kentucky being soundly affected in body with disease but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament at the same time utterly revoking all former wills made by me declaring this to be my last will and testament

First I give and bequeath to my daughter Priscilla McEnnis one negro boy Allen to her and her heirs forever at the sum of five hundred and fifty dollars with some other sum I have done for her that I cannot expect to do for the rest of my children

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Kelly one negro boy Isaac which has been previously deeded to her by deed of gift

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary one negro girl & boy Mariah & William at five hundred and fifty dollars to her & her heirs forever

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Demariah one negro boy Washington at five hundred and fifty dollars to her & her heirs forever

Fifthly It is my will and desire that my grand daughter Helen K Newton should have an equal share of my estate with my children and that my executor shall have her part of my estate allotted and assigned to her when ever he may think it advisable and to the advantage of said Helen, And the estate

Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna the following negroes viz Braxton Shibe Moses Armistead and Sarah Ann and I further give my wife five head of horses viz Jane Reg Liberty and two Cobs and two hundred acres of land to include the house and farm together with the Crop of Corn Oats

Hay and fodder and all the stock of Hogs and as many of the Cattle as she may think sufficient but it is my will and desire that my wife shall give Mary and Demariah each a bed and bedding and such other things as I have given my other daughters that have left me whenever they may need and also my grand daughter Helen K Newton one Bed & Bedding as my daughter are to have during her natural life

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughter Dianci Jane one negro girl Catharine at three hundred dollars to her and her heirs forever

Eighthly It is my will and desire that my executor shall sell my boy Fry for the best price he can get for the purpose of raising money to pay my debts and it is my
