Secondly. That all my just debts be paid. Thirdly I hereby give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary a negro girl of mine named America aged about eight years also my watch chain & seals of the residue of my estate after my just debts are provided for I hereby give & bequeath also to my beloved wife the sum of fifteen hundred dollars. Fourthly should there be any of my estate remaining after the payment of fifteen hundred dollars to my wife I give & bequeath such excess whatever it may be to my Brother George W. Mosley. Fifthly It is my wish that William R. Griffith Richard G. Hart & Doct. John Roberts residents of Davies County Ky. shall act as Executors to carry into effect this my last will & testament with instructions & authority hereby vested in them to sell dispose of & convey all my property real & personal to the best advantage either on Credit or otherwise as their Judgment shall direct. I hereby declare this to be my last will & testament hereby revoking all others made in Testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal the fourth day of May Eighteen hundred & thirty two. 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I George Ford of the County of Davies & State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make this my last will. In the first place I name and appoint my friends William R. Griffith & Doct. John Roberts of the County and State aforesaid in whom I have every confidence my Executors to carry into effect this my last will with the most perfect assurance that they will from their knowledge and their friendship towards me consent to act, I trust & hope that one or both will qualify as I have no relation near me of whom to ask the same. 2nd It is my wish & desire that my Executors have my body decently interred I have no particular choice as to the place but request that my grave be enclosed by a strong post and railing. 3rd It is my will and desire that my Executors as soon after my death as practicable sell all my perishable property consisting of household & kitchen furniture plantation utensils stock of every kind and crops of every kind and out of the money arising from the sale thereof pay my funeral expenses & all the debts I may owe, and the balance together with any money I may have on hand or may be due me by bond or otherwise keep in their hands to be applied as is hereinafter directed. 4th It is my will and desire that my Executors sell all the land I own in County of Ohio or elsewhere in this state upon such terms as they shall think best and the money arising from such sales apply in the manner hereinafter directed. 5th It is my will and desire that my slaves be hired out in the County of Davies from year to year for five years after my death & I request my Executors to hire them to good masters that will treat them well. The money arising from said hire to be collected and applied in the manner herein after directed. 6th It is my wish that Boy George be put out or bound as my Executors may think best to some good mechanic to learn a trade, a shoe & boot maker. I think a very good one but I leave the selection to my Executors, it is also my wish that he be taught to read and write if possible and I earnestly request my Executors to see that he be well treated. 7th It is my wish that girl Jane be hired to some decent family for a very moderate hire provided they will learn her to sew net spin & weave and treat her well. 8th It is my desire that my servant woman Sally and her two young children Elizabeth and Sally be hired out together. I wish her hired as a cook or house servant, as she has not accustomed to work out. 9th It is my will that all my slaves at the end of five years from time of my death be set free and I do by this my last will emancipate and set them free at the end of said time and request my Executors to do every act that may be necessary in their part to carry into effect my object. 10th It is my most anxious wish that all my servants emigrate to the Colony of Liberia in the Coast of Africa.

and I request my ^{Exor} to use all the influence to persuade them to remove as soon as they are set free under this will and should all them be willing to remove. It is my wish that my Exor pay out of any of the funds herein before mentioned the expenses of their removal awaiting themselves of all the aids & facilities that may be afforded by the Society Colonizing free people of Color.

11th It is my will and desire that the residue of the money in the hands of my Exor (from whatever source derived from the sales of perishable property, from the sales of land from the hire of my slaves as herein before mentioned) shall be equally divided between Jane George Elizabeth & Sally, Children of my servant woman Sally their respective parts or share to be paid to them at the time herein prescribed.

1st It is my wish that James part be paid to her at the time she is set free under this will particularly if she remains to Africa if she remains in this state I leave it to my Exor to pay it to her in such manner and at such times as they may think best for her welfare. 2nd George part I wish paid to him when he has learnt the trade or at the expiration of the time he may be bound out by my Exor if he remains to Liberia before that time arrives I leave it to the discretion of my Exor to make such disposition of his part as may best conduce to his interest.

3rd The other two girls parts I wish paid to them as they respectively arrive at the age of eighteen years or at such time and in such manner as my Exor may think best.

12th Should either of the four Children die before they receive their parts in that case I wish the 2^d part to be equally divided between the survivors.

13th It is my wish and desire that my Exor make such advances for the maintenance of the two youngest girls after they are set free from their parts as they may think proper.

14th It is my will and desire that my George have and my wearing apparel at the time of my death.

15th It is my will and desire that my servant woman Sally may be permitted by my Exor to take such articles of household & kitchen furniture of small value as she may select.

16th It is my desire and I request my Exor to write to my relations Thomas & Robert Ford informing them of my death and requesting them to inform my other relations of it, and of the love and affection I bear them all - I have given nothing to my relations by this will, because they are numerous and my property very small and because from my peculiar situation and the obligations I feel it imposes, I thought it the best disposition I could make of it. I die with sincere regard and affection for all my relations and in peace with all the world. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st day of October 1832.
