

113 In the Name of God Amen I Mary Knott of the County of Daviess and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and knowing the Mortality of this life do after giving my soul to God who Created it and my body to the ground by the decent burial Will and Legitimate Wish my property be disposed off in the following Manner to wit,

Item 1st It is my wish that of my estate my just debts be paid

Item 2nd It is my wish that of Clothing my sister in law Mary Knott shall have 2 Linsey dresses 1 Cotton dress 1 Calico dress and my shawl and the balance of my Clothing to be divided equally among all my brothers & sisters in law,

Item 3rd It is my wish that my sister in law Nancy Knott have my old bureau, 1 big wheel & 1 table & newest Blanket

Item 4th It is my wish that my niece Mary Ellen Knott have my loom and saddle,

Item 5th It is my wish that my brother Basil have my spurs, my earthen ware six yards of home made cloth and 3 yards of factory and what all my knives & forks & my Glass to Susan Knott

Item 6th It is my wish that my brother Joseph have the best Coward and 2 Cows Quills and his equal share of the balance of my other trading which is not otherwise disposed of

Item 7th It is my wish that the balance of my bedding be equally divided between each heir

Item 8th It is my wish that my land be sold to the highest bidder and the proceeds of the money to be returned for the Pastor of St Lawrence Church for purpose of raising masses for me and the balance after paying expenses to be equally divided between Leonard Knott Bart Knott Joseph Knott & the widow Nancy Knott,

Item 9th It is my wish that all the balance of my property not heretofore named be sold and the proceeds equally divided among the children named in the 8th Item

Item 10th It is my wish that that portion of money which would be for Leonard be applied to the payment of his just debts and should any be left it is to be equally divided between his children James Mary Ellen & Margaret

Item 11th It is my wish that W & B Buel be and is hereby appointed my executor in witness whereof I have this day set my hand and seal. December the 28th 1844.

I George S Kelly of Daviess County Kentucky being afflicted in body but of sound mind & memory do hereby constitute this my last will and testament revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Impious I give my soul to almighty god who gave it to me

Secondly I will and desire that all my just debts be paid & settled

Thirdly I hereby confirm and ratify the gift heretofore made to Daniel Murphy and my daughter Harriet their heirs of negro boy Jim together with a horse & bed

Fourthly I hereby confirm and ratify the gift heretofore made by me to William Sprabman and Polly his wife of negro girl Frances together with a horse bed and furniture & cow & calf

Fifthly I hereby confirm & ratify the gift made to my daughter Miranda Leaman of negro girl Virginia Bed & furniture

Sixthly I hereby ratify & confirm the gift heretofore made to my daughter Aunt Anderson of negro girl Rebecca Bed Bedstead and cow

Seventhly I hereby confirm & ratify the gift heretofore made by me to my daughter Lemina Hudson of negro girl Rachel Bed & furniture

Eighthly, I hereby confirm and ratify the gift heretofore made by me of negro boy Reak and a horse and cow to my son Thomas.

Ninthly, I hereby confirm and ratify the gift heretofore made to my daughter Agnes Barnes wife of James Barnes of negro girl Mary and bed & furniture.

Tenthly, I hereby devise & bequeath to my wife Jane Kelly in Trust for the use & benefit of my son George Kelly negro boy Jack with a bed and furniture and at her death or sooner if she deems it prudent she is to make an absolute title or bill of sale to said slave to the said George Kelly, or she may make a deed of trust at her death to some other person of said slave for the use & benefit my son George Kelly. It being my positive will & desire for my son George to have the benefit of the hire of said boy Jack annually, and the legal title passed to him as soon as my wife can do it in safety so as not to make said negro boy liable to be taken to pay security and other old debts now hanging over my said son George Kelly.

Eleventhly, I hereby give & bequeath to my son Talbot Kelly negro boy Scott to be delivered to him when my debts are paid by his & the other negroes here, but upon the condition that he shall pay my son Barnett Kelly one hundred dollars in cash.

Twelfthly, I hereby direct my negroes Scott Henry Waddy and Mary to be sold but by my executrix & executor hereinafter named for two years and longer if necessary and proceeds applied to pay all my just debts.

Thirteenthly, I hereby bequeath to my son Barnett Kelly negro girl Henry to be delivered to him after my debts are paid by the hire of my negroes and \$100 in cash to be paid him as herein directed by his brother Talbot Kelly.

Fourteenthly, I give to my daughter Elizabeth Ozark negro girl Tony to be delivered to her at my wife's death.

I hereby bequeath to my beloved wife & companion Jane Kelly for and during her life the plantation whereon I live - and all my personal estate absolutely, and I also give to my said wife for life the following slaves Mary, Polly & Tony & the two first Mary & Polly to be the absolute property

of my said wife and Tony at her death to belong to my said daughter Elizabeth Ozark. I hereby devise that my negroes boy Henry to be sold when my debts are paid by the hire of negroes and the proceeds to be divided out among such of my children as she may deem right and most entitled to the same.

I hereby give to my wife and my son Talbot Kelly who I appoint executrix and executor of this will full power to sell the home place before my wife's death if she wishes and impart to them full power and authority to make a conveyance for said land, the proceeds of the sale of said land whenever made it is to be divided equally among my legal heirs and if the said land is not sold during my wife's lifetime I hereby direct my said executor Talbot Kelly to sell & convey the same at my wife's death in 12 months credit and divide the proceeds among my legal heirs & representatives. In testimony whereof the said George I Kelly signs seals and acknowledges and subscribes this writing as his last will & testament.
