 Sumner, Lioma & Minerva all my stock of horses some
 sheep hogs, mules all my ~~stock~~ Plantation Tools of every
 sort, all the house hold & kitchen furniture plate & jewels
 The Crops Bonds, Debts, dues and demands, with the
 blacksmith tools, they & their increase to him & hers for
 ever. My military claims and the negroes lent to them
 Mother at her death are to be divided between Master &
 Tacitus, and Cynthia & In-Geery to them & their heirs
 forever. It is further my will that an Inventory only
 shall be made, but no appraisement or sale, Tacitus Clay
 is hereby declared to be of just age and to take possession
 of his estate without giving bond or taking any oath
 and to pay all my just debts. He being declared
 Sole Executor July 19: 1824

 Owensborough on Monday the third day of January
 1825 this writing purporting to be the last will and
 Testament of Thomas Clay Deceased was exhibited in Court
 and Lewis Jones one of the subscribing witnesses thereto came
 into Court and made oath that the said Testator in his presence
 signed Sealed and delivered the said Writing as and for
 his last will & Testament that he was at the delivery thereof
 of sound mind & memory and that he signed his name
 as a witness thereto in his presence and at his request
 and thereupon the said will was laid over for further proof

And at a County Court begun and held for
 the County aforesaid at the Court House aforesaid
 on the 4th day of February 1825 This last will & Testament
 was again exhibited in Court and William Beale a witness
 thereto came into Court and made oath to the execution
 and delivery thereof by the Testator the same was ordered
 to be recorded and thereupon a Certificate for attaining
 a probate thereof in due form is granted Tacitus Clay
 the Executor therein named and Security oath or bond
 being required of him in obedience to Testator's will it appearing
 to the satisfaction of said Court the Testator had left no
 and personal estate more than sufficient to pay all his
 debts & thereupon the said will is duly recorded in said

 for all men once to die I do make constitute and or-
 dain this to be my last will and testament Relieving
 and confirming the same and revoking all other
 wills Bequests or Bequest by me made or bequeathed in
 manner and form following viz. 1st I give my soul into
 the hands of Almighty God that gives good to me & my
 body I resign to the earth to be buried in as decent a
 manner as my Executor may see proper believing at
 the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
 and as touching such worldly goods or estate as it
 hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I will
 devise and bequeath of in the following manner.
 Item first. It is my will that my dearly beloved wife
 Mary shall be my Sole Executor of this my last will &
 Testament and heir all my Estate that I may dis-
 possess of to her own proper use and benefit
 with the following proviso that she pay to each of my
 heirs whom is hereafter named out of my estate
 One dollar in one year after my decease if they shall
 call for the same viz to Abner Spray who is intermarried
 with my daughter Mary to Richard Harris who is
 married to my daughter Sarah to John Phillips who is
 married to my daughter Susanna to John Hunt or his
 legal representatives or heirs who married my daughter
 Jane deceased to Henry Cockburn who married my da-
 ughter Nancy to Joseph Little my Son, to John Little my Son
 to James Little my Son to William Little my Son and to
 Mr. Little my Son and testimony of the same I have
 hereunto set my hand and Seal this 1st day of Feb-
 ruary 1815;
