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In the Name of God Amen. I Gideon Mitchell
 of the County of Daviess & State of Kentucky, being
 of sound mind and disposing mind & memory Considering
 the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare
 this my last will and testament in manner & form following
 (to wit) First that my executor hereinafter named shall
 provide for my body a decent burial suited to the
 wishes of relatives and friends pay all funeral expenses
 also all of my just debts to commoners owing out of
 the monies that may first come into his hands as a
 part and parcel of my estate second I will and
 desire that my son John G. Mitchell shall remain
 upon and have the free and uninterrupted use of the
 tract of land on which I now reside for the term
 of two years from this present date holding in his
 possession all of my negroes appropriating to his own
 use the proceeds of their labour for the term above
 mentioned also all of the present crop and he shall
 also pay the balances due for the purchase of the
 above mentioned tract of land after which I will
 and bequeath to my said son John one hundred
 acres of the said land including the houses also
 one third part of all the stock which may be
 on hand at the time of a division of my estate
 as hereinafter named third after my said son
 John shall have full possession of my said
 negroes for the time above mentioned then I will
 and desire that all of my said negroes shall be
 sold and the proceeds equally divided among all my
 children including the children of my deceased daughter
 Candance M. Mitchell allowing to my daughter Minerva
 Ann Budgett the privilege of taking at a fair valuation
 as a part of her portion of my estate a negro girl named
 Fanny otherwise said negro girl to be sold as before directed
 Fourth I will and desire that the remainder of the land
 as also the stock not first disposed of in the foregoing
 part of this my last will and testament shall also
 be sold in like manner and proceeds of the same
 equally divided among all my children including
 the children of my before mentioned daughter Candance

Fifth I will and desire that the portion of my
 estate which may fall to my daughter Rana Ann
 Mitchell shall remain in the hands of my executor
 after a settlement and division of my said estate
 for her use and benefit to be paid over to her as
 necessity may require during her natural life and in
 the event that my said daughter Rana Ann
 should die then her said portion of my estate to be
 paid over to her children in equal shares as they
 may arrive to lawful age Sixth I do hereby name
 and appoint my son John G. Mitchell my executor
 with full power to carry into effect all the
 provisions of this my last will and testament
 according to the true intent and meaning of the
 same requiring no security of him except for the portion
 allotted to my daughter Rana Ann Mitchell
 Seventh I do hereby revoke and declare void all
 other wills & testaments by me heretofore made In
 Witness Whereof I the said Gideon Mitchell have
 hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this third day
 of January in the year of our Lord One thousand
 Eight hundred & forty eight Gideon Mitchell (Seal)
