 I, Groves Howard, of the County of Daviess and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, but of bad health and condition of body do make and ordain this to be my last & only will & testament in words and form following to wit:
 First I give my body to the ground whence it was taken to be decently interred by my surviving friends in a plain and Christian like burial. And my immortal spirit to God who gave it me Hoping that at the Resurrection of the dead I shall receive them again both entire. In whom alone I trust for final overruling

Salvation. 2nd I give to my wife Susan H. Howard my two negro slaves viz Henry and Milly. 3rd I also give to my wife Susan H. during her natural life or widowhood the tract of land upon which I now reside but at her death over the event of her marriage it is my wish and desire that the aforesaid tract of land be equally divided between my two sons. Thomas Owen Benjamin Brodie. 4th I also will and bequeath to my wife aforesaid all my stock of cattle hogs horses sheep &c &c.

Article 4th It is furthermore my wish that in Order to pay any debts which I may owe that my representative sell of my stock &c &c enough horses and cattle to must all debts against me. But if that should not be sufficient then enough of my hogs to pay the demands which may be against me at my decease.
