uncertainty of time thereof do make this my last
will and testament in manner following that is to say
1st my will is that the expenses of my last sickness
and funeral be first paid
2nd all just debts by me owing at the time of
my death that the balance of my estate be divided as
follows. viz. I Leave all of my estate to my
beloved wife until my son James Franklin becomes
twenty and I then give unto my son all my
land on the south side of Blackfoot
Creek. I give unto my son John S Banks
all my land in Hancock County. I give unto my
daughter Mary Ann Banks one thousand
dollars on negroes the remainder of my
negroes if any to be divided amongst all of my
children. It is further my will that my three
heirs do give John C Stover a negr. worth
five hundred dollars when he becomes
twenty one. It is my will that my children
have good education. It is further my will
that my heirs do take care of my wife so
long as she remains my widow. I leave my
wife my executor without security in testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this the same day of September in the
year of our Lord 1841.
