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In the name of God amen, I Archer Johnson of the County of Mercer in State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this as my last will and testament to wit, First of all I give my soul to God who gave it me and my body to the earth whence it was taken, Hoping that in the general resurrection I shall receive them back again entire, Secondly after the payment of all my just debts and burial expenses it is my wish and desire that all my estate both real and personal shall descend in the following manner (to wit)

Item I do wish my land to remain divided just as it has been divided 133 3/4 acres to Archr Johnson and Susan Johnson my son and daughter to them and their heirs so long as they may live unless said Susan should marry in that case it is my wish and desire that the said land shall be held by my son Archer as before directed i.e. that he shall in the event of his marriage be the sole proprietor thereof during his natural life.

Item I hereby give and bequeath to my son Samuel the tract upon which he now resides containing 275 acres.

Item I also give and bequeath to my son Gregory Johnson a tract of land on the Green River run containing 243 3/4 acres.

Item It is my wish and desire that the remainder of my property be equally divided among all my children and that in said Division it is my wish that my woman slave Edy remain in the possession of my son Archer during his life.

Planning that the first item may not fully express my wish in relation to the distribution of my land named between my son Archer & Susan, I fit the state, that in the event of my daughter Susan outliving the said Archer my wish then is that she the said Susan Johnson shall become the sole owner of said tract of land specified in the first clause until said Susan should marry viewing it as being an unsuitable time for the alienation of my personal property my wish is that it remain in the hands of said Susan subject to the management and control of my son until the present crop is secured.

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I Henry J. Pruit being in a low state of health but of sound mind and disposing memory viewing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and constitute this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me made heretofore.

My will and desire is that my debts be first paid and that my children Francis Jane Harriet Mercer and Henry be raised and educated out of my estate in general and that they be not individually charged with their expenses & further now I wish them to have a good education & when Henry arrives at a proper age if it be thought advisable by my executor or his guardian if he should have one other than my executor and the interest of my estate at that time should be sufficient to pay all expenses of the estate I am willing that he should have a better & a classical education & further my desire is that my Susan receive as they arrive at twenty one years of age or marry three thousand dollars each provided nevertheless that if that sum should not exceed one fourth of my estate then & in that case they shall only receive one fourth of said estate to be paid to them by my executor in solvent Court notes or in property at the real value or part in each as my executor shall think best for the heirs & that the balance of my estate remain together for the support of the other children or child until the last one shall have become twenty one years of age or married and after all shall have received equal to the first one then I

desire that the balance of my estate be equally divided amongst all my children or the heirs of their body and in case that either of my children should marry & die before the final distribution of my estate leaving no heir of their body then & in that case my will & desire is that the residue of my estate be equally divided between my surviving children or the heirs of their body My desire further is that if my mother in law Mrs William should choose to keep house to herself that my children be permitted to spend as much of their time with her as circumstances will permit & that she be allowed to take & keep during her natural life as much of prime hard furniture as she thinks proper the latter to enable her to take care of my children when with her. In conclusion I hereby constitute & appoint my friend Silas W. Morrison my executor to carry the my last will into execution & request that he shall take the Guardianship of my children before mentioned signed and sealed the 27th day of September in the year 1845 in the presence of James L. Johnson

Item I give my Grand Son Henry Griffitt my half acre lot in the town of Warburg to him and his heirs forever I also give him my Sugar Tonge
Item the Property I allotted for my Daughter Rachel Cammins children they have received except Sarah Norton who holds a fourth part of Negro boy Henry Item I have My Son William A. Griffitt of hand if I should not receive the money in my life time My will is that the said shall be given as here directed to My Grand Son Henry Griffitt \$25 To my Grand Son William A. Griffitt \$25 To Hiram Hays \$15 Also My Grand Son Warner Brown \$15 The balance to be equally divided between his two other sons and John Hays and William Hays.

Item My Will and desire is that my old servant Man Allen shall be at my death a free man and my executors shall give to the said Allen Ten Dollars in cash
Item I give unto My Son Remus Griffitt all my Personal Property that is not devised and also all the Home hold furniture Plantation Utensils, and the Crops that be on hand at my death and my desire is that he should take the property have no sales here and Lastly constitute and appoint my Son William A. Griffitt and William Hays my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament
