In the name of God Amen. I Ignatius M. Fenwick
 of Scott County Kentucky being in perfect health of body
 and of sound & disposing mind and knowing the uncertainty
 of life and the Certainty of death do from the above
 consideration, hereby constitute and make this my last will and
 testament, as follows,

1st my will is that all my just debts be paid by my executor
 or executor hereafter named out of my estate,
 2nd whereas my three eldest children, Lucy Mary & Catharine
 having by Legacy from John P. Thomas an estate in land by him left
 to them the said children Lucy Mary & Catharine Therefore from
 natural love and feeling for all my other children equally with
 the three above named it is my special will and desire that the
 sum of fifteen hundred dollars in money or property shall be
 applied to the proper use benefit and behoof of the balance
 of my surviving children in equal shares as they arrive at
 lawful age, or sooner if hereafter expressed, The above
 amount of fifteen hundred dollars I in justice consider
 myself bound to leave to my other children as equivalent
 to the estate in land which my three eldest children Lucy
 Mary & Catharine will enjoy by virtue of their grandfather's legacy
 After the fifteen hundred dollars is thus disposed of then my
 will is that the balance of my estate be equally divided
 between ~~them~~ all my children provided nevertheless and it is
 my distinct will and desire that my affectionate wife shall
 have and singular my estate to have and hold the
 same during her natural life provided she remain a widow
 but in the event of her marrying then in that case, she is only
 to have one third of my estate during her life the residue
 is to be taken out of her hands and possession, by some
 person or persons legally appointed by the County Court for
 the benefit and use of my children as they arrive at full
 age in equal divisions

3rd my will and desire is that so long as my wife
 remain a widow that she shall act as my executrix to this
 my last will & testament and be holden to security —

4th it is my will and desire that all my unmarried
 children shall have a support in the estate I may leave
 until of full age or married

5th if any of my children being left at my death without
 education then my wife will cause the same to be educated
 and the expenses according for the same to be paid out of
 my estate the same as any of my just debts and it is my
 will and I particularly enjoin it upon her not to
 neglect their education

6th In the event that any of my children should
 marry or any other way be in need of assistance
 after they arrive at the age heretofore expressed my will

is that my wife use a discretionary power and assist the same not exceeding his or her equat dividend
