I Thomas Montgomery of the County of Daviess and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and knowing the mortality of this present life, after giving my soul to god who created it and my body to the gods by a decent burial do in this my last will and testament make this 8th day of August One thousand eight hundred and forty seven and wish that my property be disposed of as follows. (to wit)

Item 1st It is my wish and wish that of my goods and chattels all my just debts be paid.

Item 2nd It is my wish and wish that the one hundred & one acres of land the same on which I now live together with my negro girl call my household and kitchen furniture and stock of horses, cattle sheep & hogs together with all my farming utensils in a word all property are the money left after paying my debts be paid left in the hands of my beloved wife, Mary Marchy to use as she may think proper for her comfort and for the comfort of her family and that if my said wife shall have any property to spare and wish to give it to any one of her children it shall be after they shall pass the age of twenty one years and that property which she may give shall be valued by two disinterested neighbors and charged to the child or children that shall get the same and at the death of my wife Mary Marchy all the property then in her hands both personal & real shall be equally divided between
