

72 In the name of god Amen May the 25th One thousand eight hundred & thirty three, I James Rafferty of the County of Davies & State of Kentucky, Being in good health but of sound mind & memory do make this my last will & testament utterly revoking all former wills made by me declaring this to be my last after my just debts are all paid & give the whole residue of my estate real & personal & every thing that I am in possession of to my wife Hannah Rafferty during her life at her death it is my will that my land & a negro girl Susan shall be divided between my two sons Elijah Rafferty & Benjamin Rafferty the place where I now live I give to Benjamin & the farm on the Creek to Elijah the negro girl & the inclosure to be equal between them it is my will that my two sons, Elijah & Benjamin shall after the death of my wife pay two hundred dollars to Francis Shields & fifty to Duck Rogers & fifty to Elizabeth Rafferty & fifty to James Rafferty it is my will that my two sons shall have four years to pay this money without interest it is my will that after the death of my wife my son Benjamin shall have one bed & furniture & that the balance of my house hold & kitchen furniture be equally divided between my two daughters Elizabeth & Jane it is my will that my son Benjamin shall have all the stock at the death of my wife & farming utensils & carpenters tools & my Cooper tools & my two sons Elijah & Benjamin jointly Executors of this my last will, to which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of May 1833.
