In the name of God Amen, I Philip Hayden of Davies County Kentucky being weak in body and health, but of sound & perfect understanding & memory; and in the desire of arranging and disposing of all my temporal concerns as I conceive best & most conducive to the future happiness and the peace of my family do make and ordain this my last will and testament. First my soul to God its Creator and my body to the earth to be decently interred. And next it is my will that all my just debts be punctually and faithfully paid to effect which it is my desire that the executors and my or that shall hereafter fall due shall be so specially collected as the nature of cases will permit. But in case that debts which I owe should be pressing for payment by law process sooner than collections can be made of money due me, it is my will that my executors shall act on some of my property at their own discretion as they may think best to be sold (the land, or any part thereof excepted) to satisfy the demand - all my debts being settled it is my will and desire that all my estate of whatsoever kind shall remain without distribution in the hands and possession of my beloved wife Eliza Hayden to enable her to make the necessary comfortable buildings and improvement of the farm as shall be adequate to afford her a comfortable and necessary support as also the maintaining and rearing our common children without a bill of charge against any of them for their support or maintenance subject however to the following dispositions and bequest. It is my will that the negroes which I do seized and possessed of (The boy named Pat excepted) shall be hired out for wages during the life time of my wife Eliza Hayden, the one third part of which wages or income of money shall be the special property of my beloved wife to use and dispose of at her own discretion and will and my negro boy named Pat devised to her during

her life and at her death to return to my estate. (The hiring out of the negroes may be done at Public or Private sale as my executors may deem most prudent and proper) - It is my will that my children shall stay and labour in the house and on the farm (according to their sex) under the guardianship of their mother until they arrive to the age of twenty one years, or if they should marry before that age, they shall be entitled to demand and receive the equal part of the two thirds of the line of the negroes up to that time, and annually to receive their proportional part of the same during the continuation of the term of hire. And a receipt in the hands of the Executor of my will for money paid out to one or more of my children who might marry before the age of twenty one years shall be good and valid in law and in regard to the education of my children it is my will that they shall each one according to their natural capacity and talents for receiving a common education be taught to spell read and write for my daughter annexing the principal branches of arithmetic for my son and the cost defrayed out of the productions of the farm and their labour thereon under the government and guardianship of their mother. It is further my will that all moneys belonging to my estate that is not hereafter reserved to effect any particular object shall as soon as practicable be put out to interest in solvent hands with good security together with the two thirds of the money accruing from the hire of the negroes belonging to my estate, and paid over to each one of my heirs in their equal proportion in the manner as above stated. It is further my will that my beloved wife Eliza Hayden do remain in the enjoyment and possession of the premises and land which I do possessed of during her life and at her death provide the three oldest of my children are twenty one years of age. It is then my will that the land shall be sold in two lots so as to be best suited to make two farms at such instalments as will reasonably bring the best price and the proceeds of the sale equally divided amongst my heirs as also all the household & kitchen furniture and all goods and chattels of whatever kind belonging to my estate together with the negroes shall at the death of my beloved wife Eliza Hayden be sold on a reasonable credit and the money ~~derived~~ from the sale equally divided

Amongst my heirs It is further my will that the negroes belonging to my estate shall be and remain at the entire control and disposal of my beloved wife Eliza Hayden for and during the remaining part of the present year to labour in the making and securing the crops commenced of the season of cropping all which crops when made and secured is to go and be applied for the proper benefit and support of my beloved wife and children also the labour of the sd. negroes that is not necessary in the making and securing the sd. crop shall be applied to the improvement the farm and the preparation for and the making the necessary buildings for the common benefit and use of my beloved wife children, and further the note for thirty six dollars and of P. K. due the 1st January next from Urban Hayden I leave in the hands of my beloved wife Eliza Hayden to be appropriated for her and my childrens use in the supplies of provisions for the next year and with reference to reserve above alluded to it is my will and I do appropriate any amount of money not exceeding two hundred dollars for the effecting and accomplishing the building for a dwelling house also all the lumber plank shingles which I have in time past prepared for the purpose of building the same remaining now on hand, I appropriate and will that it be used and applied to the accomplishing the sd. dwelling house and lastly I do appoint & constitute my Grand Son Urban Hayden and my beloved wife Eliza Hayden Joint Executors of this my last will & testament signed & acknowledged in the presence of the subscribing witnesses the 8th day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred forty one.
