And I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Benjamin Hines my Executor to carry my said will into effect. Witness my hand & seal the 8th day of March in the year of our Lord 1848.

Third I give and bequeath to my brother Archer one negro boy Henderson during his life then to be Alexander A Davis also one negro girl Marissa during his life then her and her increase to Julia Davis and her sister Amelia J Davis also to my brother Archer two bearded bees and clothing and at his death one of the above named bees to Alexander A Davis and the other to Julia A Davis also to Archer my arms axon and cross and Cabrio also one scan mare and my part of the present crop also my Cooking Stove and fire and all of my farming furniture and all of my cupboard ware and Chair and folding leaf table and at his death the table to go to Hannah Johnson also my saddle to Hannah Johnson the wife of Samuel Johnson R. Fourth I give and bequeath to my brother Samuel & Archer jointly my stock of hogs to be equally divided also to Samuel one white figured Counterpane. Fifth I wish Eneline sold out the privilege of choosing her master on a six & better month credit and the proceeds of so give to be divided among my relatives as follows. First one hundred dollars to Rachel J Thomason and wife also one hundred dollars to be left in the hands of Rachel J Thomason for the purpose of clothing of Nancy L Davis Second I bequeath to Martha R Davis the sum of fifty dollars. Third the balance of the proceeds of so give I bequeath to my brother Archer after paying all of my just debt also one big trunk and little one to Archer. Fourth I bequeath to Alexander Davis one shot gun and Waffer Fifth I bequeath to Elizabeth R Davis one chest and band box Sixth I bequeath to Joseph the privilege of choosing either of my brother or sister for his master Seventh it is my wish that Ruth shall not be hired out Eight I appoint my brother Samuel the Executor of this
