children of the said William Lumpkin dead In
exercising the authority vested in me in determining
to whom it shall go my will is that it shall go to my
Niece Dorinda Jett daughter of my sister Mary Ann Jett
It being my distinct will that every kind of goods &
realty rights & credits and property of every description
which I may be possessed of shall go to Duffhy except
what under the will of my Father I am authorized
to give as aforesaid
