I William Haynes. Sr. of the County of Davies and state of Ky being of sound mind and disposing memory knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life now a subject of affliction do make & ordain this my last will & testament revoking all other heretofore made by me or in my name.

First I wish a decent funeral garb and expenses thereof paid & I give and bequeath to my beloved son Robt Haynes a negro boy named Henry for his own proper use and benefit.

3^d I give and bequeath to my son Jas Haynes a negro boy named Jess (which boy I bought of Thos. Lewis) and took from him a bill of sale stating his name as Charles Jordan born proper and benefit.

4th Wishing to make my beloved daughter Kitty Haynes equal with her two brothers I give and bequeath to her a sufficient part of my money or debt or estate to purchase a negro for her of equal worth with those given each of her brothers. If I should not buy one and otherwise convey to her in my life time, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Kitty Haynes a negro girl named Sarah during the life of my wife and then to my girl (Sarah) and her heirs if any to be equally divided between my three children above named to wit Robt Haynes, Kitty Haynes & Charles Haynes. 6th I wish and earnestly desire that my negro man Henry shall have his choice of my children by my first wife as his owner by him or her giving his valuation to be made by my friends whom I hereby appoint my Executors (to wit) Brnks Hardin Haynes, Wm B. Bunker & Mason C. Pate in whose hands and to their judgment I rely for a proper & impartial distribution of all the good lands, chattels rights and demands to divide among my lawful heirs as may seem just and right to them not before specified Given under my hand this 13th day of July 1847
