 Miller of the County of Davess and State of Kentucky
 being afflicted of affection of sound mind and disposing
 memory do make this my last will & testament I
 wish first of all that my just debts shall be paid
 After this is done I wish my wife Durand Miller to
 have all the property I now possess both real and
 personal land money notes and accounts here hole
 and kitchen furniture stock grain and provisions
 of all kind to have and hold the same for the benefit
 of her and my children so long as she remains my
 widow but the land shall in no case be subject to
 sale to satisfy any debt that may be contracted by
 her but in case she should marry I wish her to have
 one third of the property real and personal and
 the remaining property to be disposed of as may be
 thought best for the benefit of my children (viz) Emily
 Francis & Ann Emily Miller lives in case there
 should be another heir I wish them all to be made
 equal in case that my wife should marry the third
 part of the land that she may get I give her no
 right to sell or convey away but at her death I
 wish it equally divided between my children should
 all leave no heirs I wish that portion of the
 property to be equally divided between the
 remaining children. I herein appoint Pleasant
 J Miller my Executor to carry into effect the
 foregoing will done & signed the 3rd of August 1848

 hence do therefore publish this my last will & testament
 in manner & form following that is to say—

 serve her until she is twenty five years old then
 to be free
 2nd After all the expenses of my last sickness and

 death

 amongst my brother & sisters now living I give to her
 Ann her share of age & marriage to my niece Juliet
 Ann Duncan her share
