

appointed for all men over to die do ordain that my last will and testament in manner and form following viz I recommend my soul to God who gave it and hoping to receive a portion of all my sins thro the merits of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to be buried to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named. Item my will is that the following property be sold to pay my funeral expenses and any debt which may be by me due viz Two hand colts and saddles beds and furniture one cow and my half of a crop cults ten which is held jointly between me and my Brother in law Samuel Wilson and all my part of the horned cattle Five of drawers & one table. Item my will and desire is that my wife Mary have the use of all the rest of my estate of every kind during her natural life and after her death to be sold and the money equally divided between my four following nephews to wit James Campbell, Samuel Gibson, William Campbell & William Alexander to them and their heirs and assigns forever except one half of all the perishable property hereby bequeathed which is to be hers and subject to be willed by her as she may think proper. Item I give unto my Nephew John Campbell fifty acres of Land here on to include the mill and my dwelling house to be his his heirs forever which said land he is to have at my wife's death or not sooner. Item I give unto my Negro Woman named Judy her freedom after my wife's death also fifteen acres of Land which is the balance of the tract here on which land is to be laid off on the line from Bullcreek corner to my corner in State line to be laid off equal in width at each end which land I give ^{to my wife} and after her death to her two sons Joseph & Sack, to them and their heirs forever. Item I give unto my two Negro boys named Joseph & Sack their freedom after my wife's death under these restrictions they are to be bound out to some good trade at the discretion of my Executors until they are twenty five years of age. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint Samuel Hens Robert Alexander & William Alexander my Executors to this my last will. In testimony of which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Eleventh day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three.

I do hereby appoint my son Neal McCann and my Friend Roger Laughlin to be my lawfull Executors to this my last will and testament.
