Item first, I do will and appoint that all my lawful debts be discharged.  
Secondly That the lot of ground on which I now live be sold within one year after my decease & that the net proceeds be divided in the manner following.

I give and bequeath to my faithful & loving wife Jane Woods two thirds of the net proceeds of the above mentioned lot of land, subject to the following payments - To my daughter Margaret five dollars to my son Samuel five dollars to my daughter Rebecca five dollars, and to my son Andrew five dollars - I give and bequeath to my daughter Sophia the net proceeds of the remaining one third of the above mentioned lot of land, with one Mare, Colt, one bed & furniture, one spinning wheel and one Cow - Also I bequeath to my wife Jane Woods one Dun mare one yellow cow and Colt, and all the balance of the household furniture not given to my daughter Sophia. I do appoint my sons Samuel & Andrew executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof, I do set my hand and affix my seal the 2<sup>d</sup> day of September 1806.
