

Elizabeth Barry One Negro Girl Named Hagar  
two Feather Beds & Furniture, One riding horse  
horse & Beauro to her for the benefit of her lawfull  
heirs Not to be disposed of to or by any person  
whatsoever Thirdly I Will and bequeath unto My  
Daughter Rebecca Taylor One Negro Girl Named  
Hagar and One Feather Bed & Furniture, One  
horse & Saddle, One Beauro. Fourthly I Will and  
bequeath unto My daughter Sarah Taylor, One  
Negro Girl Named Amanda, One Feather Bed  
& Furniture One horse & Saddle, One Beauro each  
One of those My last three above named Daughters  
shall have a peaceable home with My son  
John L. Taylor until they marry then each One  
shall have the Negro above willed & her forty be-  
queathed unto them & the 2/3 Negroes brought off  
there should be any before the several Marriages  
of My Daughters and all the Moveable property  
not above willed with a peaceable home with  
My son John L. Taylor Fifthly I Will & bequeath  
unto My beloved wife Hannah Taylor three Negroes  
Named Santee Primer & Milley & their increase  
during her widowhood & at her death or Marrying  
to be divided Equally amongst My son & Daughters  
Elizabeth Rebecca & Sarah Taylors Also My  
stock of all kind Horses & Tools and all remaining  
property to the disposal of My wife Hannah
