Simon was hired to William Allen for the year 1803 at 20.11.6

Simon was hired to Henry Washburn for the year 1804 at 19.10.0

Simon was hired to G. Beatty for the year 1805 at 20.0.0

Simon was hired to Gubney the Turner for the year 1806 at 18.0.0

The Hire of Simon for the year 1801 was received by John McDowne 210
 £ 15. 6. 0

The Hire of the year 1802 was settled by an account rendered by John Gardner against the Estate of \$46.10 and the balance not collected 18.18.0

The Hire for the year 1803 was settled by an account rendered against the widow Shers of £ 7.10 and £ 3.16 paid to Mr. Cotton on an Exec. agt the Exors. 20.11.6

The Hire for the year 1804 remains in the hands of the heirs of H. Washburn except £ 3.10 paid to the Sheriff by order of the Exors to satisfy the Execution of Kyle 19.10.0

The Hire for the year 1805 was sued for and collected by J. Cotton £ 12 was paid to John McDowne and the balance in the hands of the Sheriff viz £ 8. 20.0.0

The Hire for the year 1806 was also sued for and collected by J. B. Lamary from the Sheriff and remains in his hands to settle the Execution against the Executors obtained by the Exors of Patrick McCallough decd. 18.0.0
