 thanks be given to God therefor, calling to mind the mortality of my body
 knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain
 this my last will and testament (that is to say principally and first of all
 I give and recommend my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like
 manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting that at the general
 resurrection I shall receive the same again by the power of God and as touching
 such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me in this life
 I give and devise and dispose of in the following manner and form.

Imprimis, It is my will and I do order it that all my just debts

 hundred pounds currency of the State with my black man and
 household furniture to her and her heirs forever to be ~~paid~~ and ~~paid~~

 in number fifteen, after my death to be hired out until the above sum
 of fifteen hundred pounds be raised after my stock of all kind and
 of personal estate is sold to the best advantage, then the above slaves with

their offspring be set at freedom and Liberty their names being as follows
 Lewis De Bob, Raphael Milley, Henry Jannery, Satter, Lister, Bone,
 Strahan, Saml Perry, Peter Hamoy, His my wife and I do order that John
 Mason, Abraham Bowman, Sen, John Parker and Polly Mason &
 whom I likewise constitute make and ordain my only Heir Executors of this
 my last will and testament, and I do hereby allegedly disavow
 and disanul all and my former testament wills legacies & Executors
 by me in any way before the time named Willed or bequeathed
 ratifying this and no other to be my last will and testament. In
