I Charles Tatham of the Town of Lexington and Commonwealth of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound mind and memory make this my last will and testament, I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Holmes now Nancy Tatham the daughter of John Holmes near Lexington after all my just debts are paid all my estate both real and personal which I now possess or whatsoever I may hereafter possess or in any wise own by legacy or recover by action during her natural life and to her proper use and benefit further it is my will that if my wife should again marry that the said estate descend to the heirs of her body but if she should not marry that the same shall revert to Mary Holmes the daughter of the said John Holmes and the heirs of her body and if the said Mary Holmes should die without heirs it is my will that the said estate shall revert back to Cuthbert Banks Esquire of the town of Lexington and Commonwealth of Kentucky, and Capt Samuel Coleman of the City of Richmond and state of Virginia to them and the heirs of their body after an equal division of the same. It is further my will that my brother Col. William Tatham of Richmond Virginia be allowed out of my estate five guineas to buy him a ring to this my last will and testament and for the faithful execution thereof I do appoint Cuthbert Banks Esquire of Lexington Col. William Tatham of Virginia Capt. Samuel Coleman of Richmond and Cornelius Beatty of the Town of Lexington signed sealed and published in the presence of us who have subscribed our names on the last will & testament

In the name of God Amen I John Stone of the County of Fayette and State of Kentucky remembering my mortality do now fulfil in the presence of a competent mind and sound in memory & judgement (I beseech be to God) make and ordain this my last will and testament in the manner and form following. (That is to say) first I give unto my beloved wife Jenny Stone the tract of land on which I now live with all its appertinances, and also a negro girl by the name of Hannah and forty pounds in property such as she shall choose during her natural life, and further my will and desire is that she shall also have and peacefully enjoy possess or enjoy all the rest of my estate both real and personal during her widowhood but subject to the following legacies, whereas I have heretofore given to my eldest daughter (Sally Richey) about thirty five pounds in property so my will and desire is that the rest of my children shall respectively have the same amount when they come of age or get married - beginning at my next daughter (Nancy) but my will in this case is that if in the judgement of my hereafter named Executors, these legacies cannot be spared at the aforesaid time without distressing the remaining part of the family that shall none of them have it in their power to claim the same until the youngest of them shall come of age - I also desire that my Nephew Francis Moore shall have of my estate when he comes of age a horse with twenty pounds and a new saddle provided he should live in the family until that time - and further my desire is that if in case my widow should see cause to marry again that William Stone and Henry Moore whom I hereby and appoint and ordain Executors of this my last will and testament shall pursue such measures as to them under the laws of this state shall appear best as to secure and equally divide my estate amongst my children or their heirs.
