 heirs forever. Item it is the true intent and meaning of these  
 writings that my children which are not married at this time  
 live with my wife and be supported off of my property, but my  
 wife in the same manner as if I was living until they marry  
 or is otherwise provided for and them to receive the legacies  
 devised to them in this will, when they marry after which  
 to have no further claim to any support off of the farm and  
 property but my beloved wife and devised to my son Thomas  
 Hunter. It is also my will and desire that if either of my  
 children are without lawfull begotten heirs of their own  
 body that then and in that case that part of my estate  
 devised to them to be equally divided between the surviving  
 children and their heirs forever. Lastly I constitute and  
 appoint my beloved wife Rachel Hunter executrix and my  
 son Thomas Hunter executor of this my last will and  
 Testament revoking all other wills by me heretofore made  
 & attesting this and no other to be my last will In Testimony  
 of which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal  
 this 17<sup>th</sup> day of May 1804  
 signed sealed & subscribed  
 by me in presence of  
 William Alexander  
 Charles Campbell

It is further my will and desire and I positively desire  
 that my estate be not interrupted nor any administration or  
 letters of administrations taken out but that my business be  
 conducted by my executor and family as heretofore and  
 declare this to be a part of my will 17<sup>th</sup> May 1804 Witness

In the name of God Amen I George Hunter son of the  
 County of Fayette and State of Kentucky being weak in body  
 but of perfect sound sense and memory thanks be to God for  
 the same and calling to mind the mortality of my body and  
 knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do  
 ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form  
 following, Item I lend unto my beloved wife Rachel  
 Hunter the tract of land and plantation whereon I live  
 during her natural life I also lend to my beloved wife my two  
 Negro men William and Benjamin to labor for her until they  
 are forty years of age and each of them at age shall be free  
 forever after and should my beloved wife die before the said  
 Negro men arrive to the age of forty years my beloved wife  
 Rachel Hunter may send them to her children for that  
 term of time as she thinks proper or to any child or children  
 she may have or shall have and the said child or children

kind of that is personal estate after paying out to my children  
 the legacies that will be hereafter devised in this will.  
 Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anna Parrish  
 one mare of the Value of twenty pounds and no more in  
 addition to what I have before helped her to her and her  
 heirs forever Item I also give and bequeath to my son George  
 Hunter one cow and calf and no more in addition to what  
 I have before advanced to him and his heirs forever.  
 Item I also give and bequeath to my son Richard Hunter one  
 horn creature to the value of twenty pounds each and two cows  
 calves and six sheep and one feathered bed furniture I also lend  
 to my said son the amount of what my son George has had hitherto  
 paid which I shall leave in writing to show after my death and  
 no more to him this he has forever Item I give and bequeath to  
 my daughter Rachel Hunter one horn creature and saddle to  
 the amount of twenty pounds and one bed and bedding and one  
 cow and calf and one spinning wheel and no more to her and her  
 heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary  
 Hunter one horn creature and saddle to the value of twenty pounds  
 one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf and one  
 spinning wheel and no more to her and her heirs forever.  
 Item I give and bequeath to my son William Hunter two  
 Creatures to the value of twenty pounds each and one bed and  
 furniture and no more to him and his heirs forever Item I  
 give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Hunter one horn  
 creature and saddle to the value of twenty pounds and one bed  
 and furniture and one cow and calf and one spinning wheel  
 and no more to her and her heirs forever Item I give and  
 bequeath unto my son Thomas Hunter under this record and  
 proved in this will and after the death of my said
