This last will and testament of David Robinson deceased was produced in court proved by the oaths of James Henney John B. Graves & Robinson Montgomery subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded.

In the name of God, Amen: I William Jenkins and being weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks to God, and calling to mind the mortality of man do make appointment and constitute this instrument of writing to be my last will and testament & that in the following manner VID: I first bequeath my soul to God & my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors - 2^d Such property as I am possessed of, I do now dispose of the same as follows VID: After my just and legal debts together with my funeral expenses are paid I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally Jenkins one feather bed together with the common necessary furniture appertaining thereto, also one cow and bequeath to the said Sally a cow and calf valued to be dollars or in law thereof ten dollars in cash. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Army Jenkins one feather bed now in her care together with the common necessary furniture appertaining thereto, likewise I give and bequeath unto the said Army one cow and calf valued to be dollars or in law thereof ten dollars in cash. I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved wife Pally Jenkins during her natural lifetime, if she remains unmarried the residue of my property, which is possessed by me or belongs to me at the time or time of my death. and also do constitute and appoint when my said wife Pally dies - separate her life that be the property which I now empower her to possess. See what may happen to her by her at her decease, that then the said property or the value

thereof is to be equally divided and equitably shared amongst five of my children namely - Downy Jenkins (being my oldest son) Army the late Jenkins being my eldest daughter, now living, aged 21 with John Jenkins my daughter next in age to Army Sally Jenkins and Army Jenkins above mentioned the property as above written to be equitably & equitably divided amongst my said five children or their heirs Executors or assigns - As to my son David Jenkins I am satisfied he has formerly got a child's part from me, therefore I bequeath one dollar to him to be paid by my said wife Pally if required by him. Lastly I do ordain constitute and appoint my well beloved wife Pally Jenkins aforesaid, and ^{my trusty} well beloved son Downy Jenkins to be the sole executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this tenth day of January Eighteen hundred and six 1806.
