Agreeable to an order of the Fayette County Court, the subscribers, three of the Commissioners thereon named have examined the accounts of James Morrison and Joseph H. Davie, Executors of George Nicholas dec. and make the following report.

It appears to us from the accounts papers and Exhibits produced, that of the property contained in the Inventory there was covered by a mortgage to Wilson Miles Cary Esq. of George W. Fairfax with the Equity of Redemption to Wilson Cary Nicholas slaves and one Chattel Estate, which was sold under the decree of the Fayette Circuit Court in favor of Wilson C. Nicholas against the Executors to

the amount of \$9115 (see app. No. 1) that the sales of the slaves not included in the mortgage amounted to \$1577 which were sold under the Execution of George Thompson and assigned to Wilson C. Nicholas (see No. 3) that the amount of sales of the Chattel Estate not included in said mortgage amounts to \$3476.58 of which sum \$1796.79 has been received by the Executors, the balance of said due the Estate in bonds in the hands of the Executors. To your Commissioners state that it appears from the annexed Statement that the Executors have received revenue received for the sales of the Chattel property and debts due the Estate to amount of \$44432.90 that they have paid out on account of the Estate the sum of \$17802.76 that there remains in the hands of the Executors bonds uncollected to amount of \$1684.79 leaving the balance in favor of the Executors \$5154.65, which balance we report from the annexed accounts referred to within to be due as follows, to James Morrison Executor the sum of \$2216.11 to Joseph H. Davie Esq. \$1486.20 and to James Coleman who was employed by the Executors as their agent to settle the Estate the sum of \$1363.34.

The Executors state that there are sundry other unliquidated claims against the Estate which are not in a state of preparation for settlement and which are reserved to be adjusted in their future account. But this settlement embraces all the assets which have come to their hands and they know of no other debts due the Estate or property from which funds can be raised. No allowance is made to the Executors as their Compensation, has not been fixed by the Judges of the Court of Appeals agreeable to the direction of the will of the deceased.
