Whereas I George Young Senior of the Town of Lexington Fayette County and state of Kentucky do make this my last will and testament in the manner and form following

In the first place I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Young, all the household furniture of every description I may die possessed of to her and her heirs forever. In the second place I give unto my beloved wife Mary Young during her widowhood the entire use and profits of the house I now live in with its back ground and appurtenances, with the alley on the West end thereof also thirty six pounds yearly for the first two years after my decease, and thirty pounds yearly thereafter so long as she remains a widow or so long as she will keep either of our grand children George Bright & Kitty Bright, after she will leave her, my beloved wife shall then have only the sum of fifty dollars to be paid to her yearly with the use of the house as heretofore mentioned. In the third place when it becomes necessary either by marriage or the decease of my wife Mary Young that my property be disposed of and divided as heretofore directed. In the fourth place when the property is disposed of, the proceeds shall be equally divided giving unto my grand daughter Kitty Bright an equal share in the property with my own children. Also I leave to my grand son George Bright one dollar, he being provided for by his dead father Nicholas Bright. In the fifth place I nominate, constitute, declare and appoint my wife Mary Young and my friends Jacob Blair and John Spinale executors and executor of this my last will and testament, and hereby annulling all others in confirmation of the above have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seven Signed and sealed in presence of
