Pursuant to an order of Fayette County Court appointing Commissioners to allot to Fanny Well (now Bon) her proportion of her Fathers estate, we the undersigned proceeded to allot to the said Fanny her proportion as follows, Six Negroes (viz) Reubin Molly & two children named Molly & Mary, Moses & Thamer valued at three hundred and fifty six pounds also one hundred and two pounds eighteen shillings in cash, her proportion of the land the Commissioners from the uncertain quantity that could be obtained, thought it improper to allot, the above sum of one hundred and two pounds eighteen shillings and the aforesaid negroes is the amount of the said Fanny Bon's proportion of her fathers estate, after deducting the Widows right of Dower, except her part of the land Given under our hands this 28th day = 1809.
