In the name of God Amen - I James Hill of the county of Jayette and State of Missisippi being in a sick and feeble condition, but in perfect mind and memory, calling to mind my mortality and that it is next to die, do make and constitute this my last will and testament, in manner and form following (viz) my body I commit to the earth, to be buried in a christian decent manner, and my spirit to god who gave it, and with regard to

these good worldly things with which I have been - God to endeavor to dispose of in the following manner - First to my beloved wife Margaret, I give the one third of all my estate, after all my lawful debts and funeral expences is paid off - and to my daughter Elizabeth wife to James Henderson I will that she receive one dollar, over and above what she has already received - And to my son David, I will that he also receive one dollar - And to my son John, Elizabeth my daughter and my daughter Polly - James, Fleming and William my three youngest sons, I will that the balance of my estate whatever it may be after the are all a void, and the youngest arrive to the age of twenty one years be divided between them equally and I further constitute and appoint my beloved wife Margaret, and my son in law James Henderson executor of this my will and testament revoking all and every other will or wills by me made, provided coming this, and this alone my will, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22nd day of September in the year 1808
