In the name of God amen, I James Suggitt of Jayette county being weak in body, but in perfect sense & memory have thought fit to make this my last will & testament in manner and form following. I Commit my body to the ground and my spirit to him that gave it hoping for sure redemption. I give and bequeath to my daughter Batharine Merry 300 acres of land in the tract whereon I now live to begin at the North East corner thence South twenty degrees West with William Boves line to same run thence down the run 100 poles thence such a course to a division line between my son John and myself, or will include the quantity by joining said division line and Robert Johnsons line to her this heirs forever. I give to my beloved wife Semina Suggitt all my estate both real and personal during her natural life. I give & bequeath to my son John Suggitt after the death of my beloved wife all the tract of land whereon I now live except the 300 acres above mentioned. I give and bequeath to my daughter Batharine Merry for pounds to be paid after the decease of my

beloved wife to her and her heirs forever. I give & bequeath to Batharine Merry which shall remain by treasury warrants to be equally divided between my daughters Batharine Semina and Johnston and their heirs forever after giving Robert Johnston the moiety for locating said treasury warrants. I give and bequeath to my son John Suggitt all my wearing clothes except my brown coloured coat and jacket, which I give to my friend William Tomlinson. I give to my son John Suggitt all my brown coloured clothes. I give my children Batharine Merry, John Suggitt Semina Johnston after the death of my beloved wife all the rest of my estate to be equally divided among them and their heirs forever. I nominate and appoint my beloved Semina Suggitt, John Suggitt and William Bove my whole and sole executors. Given under my hand and seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of March one thousand seven hundred and eighty six.
