In the name of God Amen I James Thompson of the County of Fayette and State of Kentucky being sworn solemnly do hereby certify and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following. I certify that I first gave and bequeath unto my son James Thompson my share of Slaves and Cattle now in the Plantation owned by my Son James Thompson purchased by him from which he now is in possession of containing one hundred and fifty

James Thompsons Will Continued

Eight acres more or less and further the said James Thompson doth bind himself to pay my three younger Children till they shall arrive to the age of Eighteen or more and shall educate them my daughter Polly my Son Charles Thompson who were well educated and my son John Thompson who was educated in the manner and my Son James Thompson is to sell the place where he is in possession of and where my Daughter (the said) Anne takes care of Eighteen or twenty he shall receive up to her and in the part of the value of the Plantation and where my son James is to sell and where Thompson shall arrive to the age of Eighteen they shall receive one half of the value of the Plantation with what he shall have and then the other half and further it is my will that the money divided among my Children paid by the said plantation if either of them be ready for it they may receive their part of it when they please but the said money shall be paid about the same time as the money due that my son Charles James Polly John and John Thompson shall enjoy in the value of the Plantation.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Jane Willey fifty Shillings in addition to what she had before given her which I give to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Nancy fifty Shillings in addition to what she had before given her which I give to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah thirty Shillings in addition to what she had before given her which I give to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sally Thomas one Shillings and twelve pence and one farthing and one half penny and fifty Dollars to be paid to her of the first money collected by my Son James Thompson which I give to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son William Thompson fifty Shillings in addition to what she had before given her which I give to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son James Thompson fifty Shillings in addition to what she had before given her which I give to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Polly Thompson in addition to what she had before given her with the three one and two pence and one half penny which I give to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son James Thompson one Shillings and twelve pence and one farthing and one half penny and fifty Dollars to be paid to her of the first money collected by my Son James Thompson which I give to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I direct that they shall be no appearance of any Estate in
