Madison County Sept 29<sup>th</sup> 1804

Agreeable to an order of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Court of Fayette to us directed we make the following report of the estate of Alexander Reid deceased. We find Anna Newman late Anna Reid has received Eighty seven pounds one shilling and ten pence, by acknowledgement being one third part of the whole estate of Alexander Reid deceased and the two thirds is three negroes named James Agnes and Jane which was appraised to One hundred and seventy pounds, and a balance of Cash Five pounds three shillings and seven pence which with the negroes is One hundred and seventy four pounds three shillings and seven pence which is the children's part of the movable property.

We have settled the whole of the accounts between John P. Newman and the heirs of Alexander Reid deceased since June 1800 until June 1805. and we find them as before stated Given under our hands this day & date above mentioned

In the name of God amen I Jeremiah Rankin of the  
 state of Kentucky and County of Fayette, being in a very  
 imperfect state of health and calling to mind my mortality  
 in the full possession of a sound mind do make and ordain  
 this my last will and testament. 1<sup>st</sup> to say in the first place  
 I bequeath my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the  
 dust until the morning of the resurrection of the just, nothing  
 doubting but it shall arise to life everlasting. And as to touching  
 my temporal concerns with which God has blessed me I desire  
 them first to the good providence of almighty God to manage  
 them for the good of my surviving family as that be for  
 his glory and their ~~temporal~~ good. 2<sup>nd</sup> to the direction of  
 my faithful Executors as they will be directed by wise wisdom  
 like the ten of the land on which they live with this few  
 instructions. first that they will espouse to sale a parcel  
 of my moveable property as can be well spared of the farm  
 at public vendue giving one year credit out of which first  
 to pay all my lawfull debts, and with the balance to procure  
 a negro man to manage the farm or what other and my  
 executors shall find convenient. 3<sup>rd</sup> I will that my son  
 Joseph whom I dedicate to God, to be employed as he shall see  
 fit be supported in his literary pursuits if it is his choice  
 until he shall <sup>have</sup> finished his education and shall be accounted  
 to him as part of his estate or whole part as his executors shall  
 see equal. As to my mansion I do allow it to be with the  
 rest of my estate to be used as need requires for the support  
 of my beloved wife and Children during her widowhood  
 and their marriage with this reserve that no more ground  
 be cleared nor timber wasted that can be spared until  
 my four score of age. I further add that should my executors  
 see cause, to sell their own possessions in order to move out  
 of this Country with the approbation of my beloved wife and  
 my Children I fully empower them to make sale of my real  
 property and move the family with them as they give  
 their own. And I do appoint my Brother A Rankin

and my Brother in law Wm C. Elliott to be my Executors of  
 this my last will and testament annulling and revoking all  
 other wills and testament heretofore made by me and confirming  
 this my last will and testament to be my only one. In testimony  
 hereof I have set my hand and seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of August one  
 thousand eight hundred and four
