 Isabella Simon late Widow of M. Murtry Decd. and that
 from a careful examination and adjustment of their accounts
 there appears to your Commissioners to be Due from the Estate
 to the said Executors the sum of twelve pounds four shillings and
 three pence and to Isabella Simon the sum of seven pounds nine-
 teen shillings. Which said accounts the Commissioners make a
 part of this report. That the Executors hired out for the
 term of six years a Slave named Simon the property of the
 estate which Slave produced One hundred and thirteen pounds
 five shilling and six pence which they have stated in their
 accounts is exhibited to us except thirteen pounds six shil-
 lings & two pence yet due to the estate from Henry Mar-
 shall - Five pounds one shilling and four pence from
 John Gardner - Eight pounds in the hands of John H.
 Maxton late Sheriff. and Eighteen pounds in the
 hands of James B. January as will more fully appear by a
 statement of sums due for hire of said Slave which is made
 a part of this report. The Commissioners further report
 that there are yet in the hands of the executors a bond of Saml
 M. Murtry and William Logan for twenty two pounds ten
 shillings - a bond of Levi M. Murtry for one pound seven
 shillings. and a bond of Thomas A. Dickerson for one pound
 ten shillings all which is submitted by the Commissioners
