Kentucky being at this time in perfect Memory and Sound mind Do declare this my last
Will and Testament in all manner as follows the Signers puts my eldest son Robert Key that
Charley said he never knew no containing a Negro and three fourth acres be the same more or
less it is also to be understood that the said Robert Key paid farther some mentioned land all
except two hundred pounds also three Negroes by the name of Joseph and his son which he has in possession
to the value of one hundred pounds for Bonds also Negroes and household furniture to the amount
of fifty seven pounds to his daughter Mary and his wife's for ever I give and bequeath
unto my eldest daughter Polly Key one Negro Girl named Rose the value of One hundred
pounds and her gearage to wit Sally Eliza and Lucy to her and her heirs for ever also
Stock and household furniture to my daughter Mary and her heirs to wit the things which she has in pigs
also two hundred pounds including the amount of her debt charged to Henryman's bond
my second son made up to living property or cash I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Margaret Key and her heirs to wit the amount of her debt charged to the same
things which she has in possession also one Negro and his wife and two
hundred pounds as my agreement with her R. G. Galwood sales to the August Galwood for her
also a Negro Girl named Lucy with one hundred pounds she and her heirs to wit Henryman
a boy after Margaret's death to be divided equally with her children also
one hundred dollars more than other parts in the value of Negroes at the first division
Provided my Children living to them and their heirs forever but if he dies or children
die without heirs of their own body the said Negroes and her share together with
the last division to be equally divided among my Children and their heirs to wit Mary
Mile and John that all the property which I have by this will to my daughter Mary
Galwood share he placed in the hands of my son Robert Key and my son in law Henry
man to be sold to be applied to the use of and benefit of her and her children and all
not be disposed of by her husband I give and bequeath unto my son John Key the tract of
land in Tennessee City where he formerly lived which I purchased from Montgomery
Belle worth two hundred pounds also one Negro Boy named David with one hundred
pounds also twenty two pounds twelve things in Stock and household furniture which
he has in possession to him and his heirs for ever I give and bequeath unto my two
daughters Jane and Lucy Key as follows one Negro Girl each to wit the Mother of
one hundred pounds each also the deficiency to be made up in money or property
that may suit them also Stock and household furniture to the amount of twenty seven
pounds to each thing and also my tract of land in Fishing Creek containing Nine
Hundred and fifty seven acres to be equally divided between them both so that
two hundred pounds each of good the deficiency to be made up in money or property
out of my Estate the land lies as mentioned lies on the waters of Cumberland
River near the Green River and it being the one half of fifteen hundred and one
thirty four acres Military Warrant No 990 Granted to Charles Quiner and John
Key the whole of the above property and their increase of Negroes to them and
their heirs for ever in place of the above named negroes to be given to my two
daughters Jane and Lucy each I do hereby bequeath to the same Margaret &
