

Trayette County, Tenn. May Court 1842.

This certificate of the Commissioners appointed to settle with Elizabeth Young as Guardian of the Daughters of James Young, was produced in Court and ordered to be recorded. *Attest* John D. Young, Clerk.

Trayette County John Major, Benjamin Martin and James Nichols came before me a Justice of said County and took the oath agreeable to Law as Commissioners to settle the account of the said James Young, under and in pursuance of an Order given under the Great Seal of the State of Tennessee on the 15th day of May 1842.

John M. Daniel of Trayette County Tennessee being the surviving last Will and Testament of said deceased James Young, together with the said James Young, Dollys, late paid under the said James Young's will, the said James Young, and

James Young, each and none, late legatee for Hundred Dollars, each the said James Young, late paid to them as they respectively came of age. The said James Young, and James Young, late legatee, the said James Young, to be equally divided among them and each equal Division to be paid to each as he or she comes of age or marries.

Such of my Children as are not named in this Will have already received an equivalent to the legacies made above by me to the other Children. All the remainder of my property both real and personal I give and bequeath unto my Wife Elizabeth M. Daniel for and during the Term of her Widowhood. In case of her marriage it is my desire that she enjoy the thing in the manner as if I had made no Will, and to which no would in such case have been entitled by Law. After my decease it is my Will that my property be equally divided among my surviving Children or among their heirs. Such heirs receiving their share of that Division which could have been received by their ancestor. I have also by this my last Will and Testament, I have appointed my wife aforesaid Mary M. Daniel, Widow and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament, I have with my Seal and I and this 15th day of July, 1842, done and signed at the County of Trayette, Tennessee, Eight Hundred and Ninety.

In Addition to the above I the said John M. Daniel do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Tucker the sum of Fifty Dollars.
