

in the interest of the King. It is my will & pleasure that my executors may dispose of the land for a reasonable price as they may think most for the interest of the King. It is my will and desire that my executors shall collect my debts and dispose of such part of my personal estate, as will not be wanted for the use of the family on the farm by and with the consent of my wife Jane. It is my will and pleasure that my estate be equally divided among my children, my son David, Robert and John my daughters Polly & Elizabeth such times as my executors shall think it most to their interest, it being understood that the farm is not to be sold till after the death of my wife Jane after which time the executors shall be at liberty to sell the farm & divide the proceeds of the same as above. It is my will & pleasure that my executors do make a deed to the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Church as soon as they may complete the payments for the same, likewise the lot sold to Alexander MacGregor on which he has erected a heavy reservoir as he shall demand the payment of the same. Finally I constitute Robert Patterson Samuel Adams Alexander Parker and Thomas Wallace and my wife Jane our executors and trustees to this my last will and testament.
