We the undersigned for ourselves and on behalf of the Infants representations of the Estate of ^{the deceased} John Todd deceased have by consent agreed to Divide the following slaves agreeable to the value appraised by Edward Payne herewith annexed; in pursuance of said consent we have met at the house of Robert Todd this 26th day of October 1811 and having allotted the said Negroes into five Claps, and having drawn for choice, we consent to the following Division, to wit:

No. 1 To James Moore, consisting of Milly her Daughter & Peter the son of Lucy, estimated as six Hundred Dollars and to pay Robert Todd who drew No. 3. four Dollars, and John Todd Burrington who drew No. 4. one Hundred and three Dollars

No. 2 To Daniel Webb who drew No. 5. one Hundred and three Dollars
