In the interest of the heirs. It is my will and desire that my executors may dispose of the land for a sum of money to be at their own discretion for the interest of the heirs. It is my will and desire that my executors shall collect my debts and dispose of such part of my personal estate as will not be wanted for the use of the family on the farm by and with the consent of my wife Jane. It is my will and pleasure that my estate be equally divided among my children my son David Robert and John my daughters Polly & Elizabeth at such times as my executors shall think it most to their interest, it being understood that the farm is not to be sold to after the death of my wife Jane after which time the executors shall be at liberty to sell the farm & divide the proceeds of the same as above. It is my will & pleasure that my executors do make a deed to the Trustees of the Danish Church as soon as they may complete the payments for the same, likewise the lot also to be sold at the place on which he has created a highway and soon as he shall prompt the payment of the same. I finally do substitute Robert Patterson Samuel Byrnes Alexander Parker and Thomas Wallace and my wife Jane as executors and executrix to this my last will and testament.
