Parker Estate

In Pursuance to an order of the Worshipful Court of Fayette County made at their August term 1805 the undersigned have proceeded to sell to Elizabeth Parker relict and widow of Robert Parker dec'd her right of dower in the following tracts and lots of land viz The Mill and plantation on a tract of one hundred acres on South Elkhorn. The Old place including Smiths on a tract containing one hundred and fifty acres South on a place containing twenty acres, the house and two out lots on which it stands and a spring in the town of Lexington on which the widow now resides, a frame house and part of an inn lot on main street in said town nearly opposite the Courthouse and now rented to Walker Baylor one half of the house and lot on said lot and occupied by George Anderson, the log house and half lot on which it stands occupied by Patterson Bean One half of the lot and Stone Quarry adjoining on Main Street at the lower end thereof in said town occupied by John Ethard And for the greater ease and convenience both of the widow and heirs of the aforesaid Robert Parker dec'd we have assigned to said widow the two out lots on the town of Lexington (one of which she now resides and the other a spring) with all the improvements and appurtenances belonging thereto and a frame house of the part of a lot on which it stands on main street in said town and now rented to W.
