and state of Kentucky being through the abundant mercy of God  
to me in this day yet of a sound mind & memory do make  
this my last will and testament. Now I commit my body  
to the dust from whence it was taken, and my soul to God  
my maker in certain and sure hope of the resurrection through  
our Lord Jesus Christ as to my worldly estate which it has  
pleased God to bestow upon me it is my will and desire that  
it shall be disposed of as followeth (W)

I wish all my just debts to be paid. Now I give  
to my friend John Graves forty three pounds which I give  
to him and his heirs forever. Now I give to my be-  
loved wife Patsy Parrish all that is due me for the hire  
of the negroes which I got by her together with every thing that  
came by her to me as her former dowry. Now I bequeath to my  
beloved wife Patsy Parrish my negro man Tom during her  
natural life. Now after the death of my dear wife I give  
my negro man Tom to my sister Nancy Burt to her and  
her heirs forever. Now whereas there are several debts due me  
which I desire to be paid from my estate I give
