First, my will and desire is that all my just debts and funeral
expenses be paid. Second, I will and bequeath to my
beloved wife Catherine Marshall my gold watch riding chair
and com^o cupboard, also my negroes Levi and Rachel child
Child, to her and her heirs forever

Third, to my son John Marshall my silver watch and desks
and negro Sally, also a horse of the value of one hundred dollars
and one hundred dollars in cash so soon as he is twenty one
years of age to him and his heirs forever.

Fourth, To my daughter Polly W. Marshall my clock and
ward and silver horn also negro Betty and her child, to her
and her heirs forever. Fifth, to the two children of my
deceased brother William Marshall when the arrival of age
the sum of fifty pounds each to them and their heirs forever.

Sixth, I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Catherine
Marshall one equal one third part of all the residue of my
estate real and personal to be held and her heirs forever

Seventh, I will and bequeath to my daughter Polly W. Marshall
share and my son John Marshall the remaining two thirds of
my estate real and personal to be equally divided between them to
them and their heirs forever

Finally, I constitute and
appoint my trusty and faithful friends Henry Clay, George
Foster junior, George Haydel and John M. Boggs executors of this
my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills

vania University the fee simple of the land I have now

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Taking into serious consideration the uncertainty of human life and that I am to make this my last will and testament by disposing of my possessions in the manner following viz. To my daughter Sarah I give the following negroes Archie Ducky & Patience to her & her heirs for ever. To my son John I give Abraham Sam Abraham

son of Thomas & to be here forever to each of them my children as soon as they come of age or marry two beds of furniture, two trundle beds and such other furniture for housekeeping as may seem to me or other children. To Robt Todd my daughter Ann I give one division of my Michman tract of land in Fayette County, according to the division of said tract made by him & my cousin Levi in the year 94. that he along next to his other tract adjoining to them and to their heirs forever, only with this reserve, that if my son John should within 10 years from my decease go to settle in that country, the aforesaid tract I give to him & his heirs forever if he chooses it. & in that case I give to Robt Todd the other division of the said tract in Michman otherwise to remain as first given to Robt Todd & Ann forever. To James eldest my daughter & her husband be wife the west or middle division of said tract as divided aforesaid to them and to their heirs forever. To the Rev Dan McCalla my daughter Elizabeth his wife I give four hundred acres of the tract I now live on in Lousin Co to be laid off at the upper end next the Ch line by a line straight across this tract from the lines adjoining Northward & Southward i.e. from the Ch line to Rutherford as square as can be convenient to them and to their heirs forever. To Doctor Andrew Todd & my daughter Eliza his wife I give four hundred and fifty acres of said tract to be laid off square across the tract and along side of the former laid off for Mr McCalla to them & their heirs forever. The remainder of this tract including houses, mill and all other improvements or appurtenances I give to my son John & to his lawful heirs forever, reserving to my beloved wife such part of the land as she shall choose during her natural life, as the houses, such household and kitchen furniture, as she thinks necessary for use, six head of cattle including two work oxen, and a cart, two good horse team & six negroes at her choice during her natural life, the stock to remain with the dwelling house. The remainder of my negroes not herein given away, I order to be equally divided among the children above named at my decease or if necessary to be hired out to discharge my debts and then divided equally among
