October 29th 1804. Dearing it mind that it is appropiate to all men once to die. I Robert Lyle of Fayette County & State of Kentucky do make out express this my last will and testament. 1st It is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid by my Executor hereafter to be appointed. 2nd It is my will that my wife Jane Lyle shall have a support on the land which I lately purchased

this out of the dwelling house on the same, and the negro girl Doral to be at her command during her life provided she shall be employed for the benefit of the mistress of said girl. 3rd I order and it is my will that my land be vested in my son John Lyle to him and his heirs forever. I also will to have my waggon and horse given and forming utensils of every kind provided he will maintain his mother during her life and the children that are under age until the arrival at that period. 4th It is my will that the stock be appraised and the value thereof together with three hundred and eighty five dollars be given to my daughters in equal proportions to be paid in property or cash as they can agree.

5th It is my will that the money due to me in Virginia be applied to the payment of the balance due Mr. White for the land. 6th It is my will that the household and kitchen furniture remain for the use of the family that may reside together. 7th It is my will that out my negro girl Doral should survive after the death of my wife that she be given to my daughter Julia to be & her heirs but she is not to be sold out of my family. And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint John Calkins & John Lyle sole Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all wills heretofore made.

In the name of God Amen I Sam. Webster of Spencer
County being completely and lawfully of perfect mind and memory
 I thank God calling to mind the mortality of my body, and
 knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do hereby
 ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally
 and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hand
 of God that gave it, and my body to the earth to be buried
 in decent Christian burial, at the direction of my executors, hoping
 at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the power
 of God, and as touching my worldly estate - I give devise make
 dispose of the same in the following manner and form - First I leave
 to my well beloved wife Ann Webster and to her use during her nat-
 ural life, two negroes that is Alting and Wimsey, also a feather bed and
 furniture, also one black mare and two choice cows and calves - also five
 hundred weight of good pork - also eight head of choice hogs, also a
 choice pair of sheep - also all my household and kitchen furniture, also
 my present crop of corn - also as much forage as will feed her stock
 this present winter - also all the cotton and wool that I have at present
 also such plantation utensils as will be sufficient to cultivate the
 plantation, and at her death to be equally divided between all my chil-
 dren except my deceased daughter Fanny Pannell & -
 I leave I give to be equally divided by lot the residue of my
 stocks of negroes between all my children except as before except
Necessaries, should either of my three youngest children have a lot that
 from their appointment they would have to pay any money to the
 other legatee, that they shall have at least eighteen months to pay
 it in, and as the remainder of all my stocks of all kinds to be
 equally divided between all my children except as before
