The will and testament of Catherine Kelley deceased was produced in Court and proved by the oaths of Robert Patterson and James Richey subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded

Know all men by these presents that I Andrew Steele of Fayette County and State of Kentucky do make and constitute this my last will and testament 400 In witness whereof I do call and request unto you John Steele my man now four and four hundred acres appearing appearing at the direction of my executors to divide that and all the lands belonging to me contained in a settlement right two hundred acres of treading vacant and five hundred fifty eight acres of land which I do give and bequeath unto my son John and my son Williams as by patent may appear running at the said times into the lands of David Vance one half of the land obtained in said last mentioned treading vacant two hundred acres paying half the expenses that may accrue from procuring a title to said lands. Furthermore I bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Elizabeth Anne Jane and Susanna Steele and Anna Steele after all debts are paid an equal share of my real lands and to Anne Steele an equal share with the rest of my children daughters. Reserving at the same time unto John and Williams Steele a proportional share in the division of said real lands and do further constitute and appoint the Rev. Samuel Shannon and Robert Patterson my executors of this my last will and testament. Witness my hand and seal this 17th day of August 1795. one thousand seven hundred and ninety five
