My lands slaves and the remainder of my estate shall and direct shall be equally divided between all my children their shares to be allotted them as they respectively arrive at the age of twentyone years or marry or sooner if circumstances may direct. I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends John Parker, Genl. Robert Todd and Thomas Reddy executors of this my last will and testament hereby giving and granting to my said executors full power to comply with all my contracts in such manner as they may think most to the interest of my estate and full and complete power to execute deeds of conveyance or other writings that may be necessary to carry my contracts into effect and to receive the true use of my heirs dues for land that I claim and have not got the legal title for. It is my sincere will and desire that all my children shall be carefully brought up and well educated and if either of them should appear promising for a professional character I wish him or them to receive as complete an education as any estate and other circumstances will admit of. I bequeath to my nephew the Rev. Mr. Reddy my negro boy Andrew. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 1800
