Bygone 10 From the last will and Testament of Morgan
Byrant dec'd what was duly proved, in the Court of the
County aforesaid, and recorded in my office —

I Extract the following Bequests. I Bequeath to her
(my wife) six cows and ten sheep, also to her a negro man
named Jim and the negro woman named Luce her
life time and then to go free, the young negro at the
disposal of my wife as long as she lives, and after
her death I will and bequeath to my daughter Susan
the two young negroes named Jack and Charlotte
until they turn Jack and Charlotte are separately
Twenty seven years of age, and then to go free
and to Morgan Byrant son, to my son Joseph Byrant
I will and bequeath to him the said Morgan Byrant
just the young negro Boy named Noah, until he
is twenty seven years of age, and then to go out
free, and to Mary Byrant, daughter to my son Joseph
I will and bequeath a young negro girl named Lela
until she is twenty seven years of age, and then to
go out free, the youngest negro child at the disposal
of my wife so as that she shall go out free at the
age of twenty seven years. This will is dated September 29th 1799.

In the name of God Amen I John Young of the County
of Fayette and State of Kentucky being weak in body but
of sound mind perfect memory and calling to mind the
Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die do ordain this my last will in manner
and form following viz I recommend my soul into the
hands of them that gave it not doubting but that I shall
receive the same through the merits of Jesus Christ and
my body to the earth to be buried at the direction of my
executors hereafter named. Item It is my will and desire
that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid.
Item I give to my two grandsons John and Charles Reeder
the land that their father and mother to be equally divided
between them and to my grand daughter Polly Practor
I give her a negro woman by name of Mary a girl that
her father and a negro girl by name of Luce to them
and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my
son Andrew Young the tract of land wherein he now lives
only he is to pay up to my estate the value of one hundred
acres to be laid off in good form on the end of the land next
to David Hulse and Richard Youngsons, the said land to be
valued by a white man and a negro man by name of Jack
and a negro woman by name of Luce and to him and his
heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Billy
Young two hundred acres of land including the mill and
including the Humphries. I have cleared and to be cleared
Lynchburg live in as good a form as the situation of my land
of land will allow me the said land to be laid off in
