Third the rest of my estate real and personal I will and devise to be equally divided amongst the afternamed persons wit^h Eli Garritt, Lewis Garritt William Garritt Morris Garritt Thomas Garritt Rebecca Garritt and Phoebe Garritt to them and their heirs forever but if any of the above named persons should die without issue their part to be equally divided amongst the survivors. Lastly I do constitute & appoint my faithful friend William Hamilton of Fayette County sole executor of this my last will and testament with full power and authority to convey my lands by deed to the above named legatees also due to James Robinson for a certain parcel of land on the waters of Galyp river also to collect all my credits and pay all lawful debts & whatever he may be his duty as an executor - And I do hereby revoke and annul all and every former will & testament legacies & bequests by me before made or made and hereby ratifying and confirming it no other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this day and year above written

This last will and testament of Morris Goyne deceased was produced in court proved by the oaths of James Piggly & James Hamilton subscribing witnesses thereto and entered to be recorded. And on the motion of William Hamilton Executor mentioned in the said will who made oath according to law Certificate is thereto granted him in due form he giving security Whereupon he together with Goyne R. Tompkins and Matthew Caldwell his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in

the penalty of three hundred pounds as determined by the law which is ordered to be recorded
