 County being sensible of the decay of Nature and the certainty of death and being
 desirous to dispose of my estate after my decease do hereby make this my last
 will and testament in the following manner Viz after all my lawfull debts
 paid I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Nancy Johnson the one half
 of all my estate both real and personal to her and her heirs forever. I then
 give and bequeath the other half of my estate above mentioned to my son
 Mark Johnson to him and his heirs forever. I then I give and bequeath
 unto my Grand Daughter Patsy Wood five pounds out of each of the above
 legacies whenever she may leave her Grand Mother or come of age. I then
 I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Nancy Anderson my Daughter Patsy
 Woodrige my son Joseph Johnson my son Matthew Johnson my Daughter
 Nancy Robinson my Daughter Mary Edrington to each one Shilling of my aforesaid
 Estate and also to my Daughter Rachel Canoy one Shilling also. and
 lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved Wife Nancy Johnson
 my Executor and my son Mark Johnson my Executor, to this my last
 will and testament hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me
 and to be my body to be buried at the discretion of my aforesaid Executors. I do
 hereby having shew hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 7th
 day of June 1804
