I Amian Blagell of the County of Fayette
and State of Kentucky do make this my last
will and Testament in manner and form following
First It is my desire that all my just debts and
funeral expence be paid the rest of my estate
I divide in the following manner. I lend unto
my wife Euphens all my estate of every kind both
real and personal during her widowhood and at
her death or marriage it is my desire that my
land be equally divided betwix my four sons Thomas
James, Samuel, and John, which I give to them and
their heirs forever and if either of my four should die
before they come of age then in that case their part
of my land to ascend to my surviving four and the
balance of my estate I divide amongst all my children
in such manner as the girls to have twice as much as the
boys to them and their heirs forever and if my wife should
marry in that case I give her the third of all my estate
during her natural life and at her death to be divided
as above directed and if any of my children after they
come of age should want any part of my estate and my
wife should have it in his power to let them have it
my executors are to have and valued by disinterested men
and they are to be charged with the amount of the same
in the division. Lastly I constitute my two friends Aaron
Pierth and David Baker executors of this my last will
and Testament revoking and annulling all other

will and Testament as witness my hand and feet
this 23rd day of July 1805

negro girl named Lucy. Item I give and bequeath to my
daughter Tom Vanphan a negro boy named Jacob. Item
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth all the
one feather bed and furniture. Item I give and bequeath
to my son Guy Smith my negro fellow named Charles. Item
I give and bequeath unto my son John and William Smith
after they have paid all my just debts all my land and the
remainder of my negroes. Item I give and bequeath
with the whole of my personal estate to be equally divided
